
Organisation

- Consortium of 11 key institutes (and growing!)
 - Operated within the University of Iceland, which funds the day-to-day operations.
- Centred around projects funded by the Infrastructure Fund.
 - Each project governed by an administrative board.
- Part of the first Roadmap for Research Infrastructure in Iceland since 2021.
 - Future of Roadmap not clear.
- Homepage: mshl.is

The funded projects

- Historical Farm and People Registry
- Icelandic models for Transkribus
- Automatic speech recognition of folklore audio recordings
- 3D scanners
- RUV digital transfer of audio recordings
- Manuscript catalogue (handrit.is)
- Sarpur cultural database
- New projects being developed for funding applications

Long-term objective

- Developing a "service centre" for researchers working under the DH umbrella.
 - In collaboration with IREI: Icelandic e-Research Infrastructure.
- A major opportunity, but also a major challenge.
 - Funding for the CDHA very limited and not secure (as opposed to the projects).

Ownership and access

- New projects owned jointly by members of CDHA.
- Existing projects, developed by CDHA:
 - Main principle: Ownership stays with the original owner.
- All projects are Open Access as far as possible.
 - Exceptions due to copyright and privacy issues.
- Challenge: Access to data for research purposes.
 - The visual arts a special problem (but not the only one!). Need a new contract with The Icelandic Visual Art Copyright Association.

Collaboration, domestic and international

• Domestic:

- IREI: Icelandic e-Research Infrastructure (another Roadmap project).
- Language technology (incl. CLARIN).
- International:
 - Institutional member of DARIAH.
 - Hosting the Digital Humanities in the Nordic and Baltic (DHNB) annual conference in 2024.
 - Minnesota Population Centre (for census data).
- A number of more specific projects.

Research: The criterion of success

- The future of CDHA depends on new research and research opportunities.
 - The whole rationale of the Roadmap!
- Our projects can already be used.
 - Domestic funding applications currently being developed, using one or more of our projects.
- The Centre is participating in international projects and applications.
 - *Digital Action on Climate Change with Heritage Environments* (Northern Periphery and Arctic Programme, funded 2023).
 - A funding application being developed by a NOS-HS network!!!

Impact

- Our projects (funded or not) relevant to stakeholders outside the network and to society in general.
- Databases and tools relevant:
 - to start-ups and industry;
 - for teaching at different levels;
 - for curious citizens and anyone eager to become an explorer;
 - for regional development;
